The Handsworth Royals are moving back to Triple A this season but before that they'll tune up by taking on a now-former Western AA Conference foe in the Carson Graham Eagles in the annual Buchanan Bowl.

The game will go down as the 27th official Buchanan Bowl on record. The Eagles lead the all-time series 16-10 and have won seven of the last eight Buchanan Bowl clashes.

This will be the Royals' first official pre-season tilt. They played a controlled scrimmage last week against the West Vancouver Highlanders. The Eagles began their pre-season with a convincing 48-14 win over Riddle (Ore.)

Four of the Eagles' scores came via the air last week and, with the Royals being led by former SFU QB great Jay Prepchuk, this game could mean a lot of gun slinging action from both sides.

The Royals and Eagles met once during the regular season last year – the 26th annual Buchanan Bowl – with Carson Graham scoring a 22-19 victory.

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

- John Barsby RB Brandon Parker had five carries for 141 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the Bulldogs' 81-0 romp over the Duchess Park Condors
- WJ Mouat RB Maleek Irons lasted just over one quarter in the game versus Salisbury Composite before being shut down with a leg cramp but still managed to rack up over 100 yards including a 24-yard touchdown run.
- Mission QB Evan Horton, who takes over as the number one man behind centre with previous starter Kevin Wiens now a member of the UBC T-Birds, threw went 6-of-8 for 182 and had two touchdown passes in their 41-7win over Nanaimo District. He also rushed eight times for 122 yards and had two touchdowns.
- St. Thomas More QB Chase Malcolm had four touchdown passes despite only throwing for 73 total yards in the Knights' 43-0 shutout win over Holy Cross.
- Ballenas RB Thomas Franks had 12 carries for 137 and a pair of touchdowns in their 51-0 win over Spectrum.
- New West RB Tommy Robertson had three rushing touchdowns to lead his team in their 20-16 win over South Delta.
- Mt. Doug RB Marcus Davis had four TDs in his team's Wednesday win over Spectrum. He racked up 102 yards on just three times rushing, and caught two passes for 86 yards
