NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

- **Carson Graham RB A.J. Blackwell** had 16 carries for 142 yards and a pair of touchdowns to help his team to a 31-14 over Handsworth in last week's Game of the Week
- **South Delta REC Jack McDonald** had a touchdown reception and a pick six to help the defending AA Varsity champs knock off Rick Hansen 36-20
- **Centennial RB JP Kalambay** had two touchdowns – one catch and one rushing – as part of his team's 38-0 walloping of Seaquam.
- **GW Graham REC Trey Walsh** caught a 38-yard pass for a touchdown in a 14-8 losing effort to Kelowna. It was GW Graham's first-ever score in varsity football. Walsh also had an interception on defence.
- **Ballenas FB Colin Laplante** was a big force on defense in his team's 14-7 win over Hugh Boyd. He had 12 tackles, an interception and a fumble victory. He also scored the game-winning touchdown on a two-yard run on offence.
- **St. Thomas More LB Noah Usherwood** had 10 tackles and one sack in his team's 28-7 win over Notre Dame.
- The New Westminster Hyacks named their entire offensive line as their Player of the Game following their 35-20 over Sequim. The O-line played a big part in helping the Hyacks put up 21 second half points – including a major from a 99-yard drive – as part of their big win.
- **Vernon RB Karson Patommel** had 23 carries for 177 yards and four touchdowns to lead his team to a 33-6 win over Clarence Fulton.
- **Lord Tweedsmuir RB Jamel Lyles** scored all five of his team's touchdowns in a 36-30 win over John Barsby. Lyles carried the ball 19 times for 168 yards scoring four majors, and also had a 48-yard pick six.
- **Vancouver College RB Robbie Welch** had three rushing touchdowns to help his team knock off Mt. Boucherie 33-28.
- **Terry Fox REC Jason Shamatutu** had three touchdown receptions as part of his team's big 43-7 win over West Vancouver.
- **Frank Hurt RB Bash Sise-Odaa** scored four touchdowns while running for 140 yards in his team's shutout win over Argyle.
- **Belmont REC Cody Wist** had a 75-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and added a 20-yard touchdown reception, in his team's 3-6 win over Pitt Meadows.
