MT. BOUCHERIE BEARS AT SOUTH DELTA SUN DEVILS

The 2015 BC High School Football playoffs get underway this weekend, and one of the highlight contests pits the defending champion South Delta Sun Devils (2-3) against the Mt. Boucherie Bears (2-4) in a clash at Burnaby Lake with the winner moving on to face the Terry Fox Ravens.

The Bears, who finished fifth in the Eastern Conference, are coming off a 38-21 win over Lord Tweedsmuir. Several players to look out for on offence include Tyler Toic, who finished the regular season with the top AAA passing statistics with 73-of-144 completions for 1180 yards and 11 touchdowns. Toic's favourite targets are likely to be Spencer Schmidt and Dayton Moore, who finished the regular season as the top-ranked and fifth-ranked players in the AAA ranks among the receiving corps with 23 catches for 520 yards, and five touchdowns and 19 catches for 350 yards and two touchdowns, respectively. On the ground, Ty Truong is expected to be the team's leading rusher after leading the team with 302 rushing yards this season and recording two scores along the way. On defence, the Bears boast Taylor Knoll, who led the league with 51 tackles, four sacks, and three interceptions, and will pose a challenge for the Sun Devils.

The Sun Devils, who are led by pivot Kyle Chace, finished fourth in the Western Conference and are looking to win games when it counts during the playoffs. Last week, the Sun Devils ended their regular season with a 35-24 loss to the New Westminster Hyacks by surrendering three second-half touchdowns. They'll hope to right the ship when it matters the most and try and learn from yet another setback. One player you won't want to miss is Grant McDonald, who will be all over the field after finishing as the team's leading rusher with 58 attempts for 321 yards and two touchdowns, as well as recording 41 tackles and one fumble recovery in five games on defence. On special teams, a player who could make a big difference is Michael Calvert, who ranked first in the league in punt returns and also recorded two punt returns for touchdowns of 45 and 60 yards earlier this season.

Both teams are out to prove they can win the big games. Who will come out on top and earn a date with the Ravens? Find out this Friday!

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

- Argyle **QB Cole Theobald** had 200 yards in the air throwing three touchdown passes, while also rushing for 107 yards on five carries including a 68-yard touchdown in a 38-7 win over Argyle.
- Handsworth **QB Sam Tholl** went 16-of-23 for 258 yards and four touchdowns in a 35-14 win over Salmon Arm. **REC Jacob Ghazizadeh** had a pair of touchdown receptions, while **RB John Mooney** had 17 carries for 101 yards.
- Vancouver College **RB Michael Le** had 28 carries for 111 yards and a touchdown en route to being named MVP of the 59th Archibshops' Trophy game in a 17-14 win over Notre Dame. **Luke Avon** and **Chris Ellis** had 10 tackles each in the victory.
- Mt. Douglas **RB Declann Michielin** had a pair of rushing touchdowns, and a touchdown reception, as part of a 43-7 win over Belmont. He finished the game with 10 carries for 91 yards. **QB Gideone Kremler** threw three touchdown passes as part of a 114-yard passing performance.
- New Westminster QB Jamie Shiho, returning to the line-up after a two-game absence, rushed for 118 yards on 11 carries while scoring two touchdowns in a 35-24 come-from-behind win over South Delta. **RB Jordan Guzman** rushed for 82 yards including one for a touchdown, while **Gurvir Ghuman** led the team with eight tackles and a sack on defence.
- St. Thomas More **RB Luca Bellini** rushed for 183 yards and both of his team's majors in a 14-7 win over Kelowna. He also recorded six tackles and a sack as a linebacker.
- Terry Fox's **Isaac Evans** had five tackles and four sacks in a 37-7 win over Centennial.

- Vernon **TB Jonah Anstey** had eight rushes for 117 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while **QB Justin Haverkamp** went 8-of-12 for 129 yards and two touchdowns in a 52-0 win over Clarence Fulton.
- Valleyview **RB Hunter Koopmans** had a pair of rushing touchdowns in a 12-7 win over Westsyde. **DE Clayton Bailie** had five tackles and one sack, while **RB/LB Brooks Miller** rushed for 58 yards and led the linebackers with seven tackles.
