GW GRAHAM GRIZZLIES AT NEW WESTMINSTER HYACKS

After an outstanding 33-0 performance over number one ranked AA power John Barsby, the GW Graham Grizzlies (1-0; 0-0) will visit Mercer Stadium to face the New Westminster Hyacks (1-2; 0-0) for Homecoming under the Friday Night Lights.

The Grizzlies had a solid performance last week containing the Bulldogs to just 76 yards of offence on the day. In the shutout, defensive back Ethan Mastin and safety Tristan Davis forced and recovered a fumble and had an interception, respectively, as part of a strong Grizzlies effort. On offence, quarterback Gabe Olivares went 13-of-16 for 205 yards and touchdown passes to Emerson Smith and Baker Douglas. Von Richardson led the ground attack with just eight carries for 104 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while receiver Tyler Sprott led the pack with three receptions for 75 yards.

The Hyacks, who are coming off a hard-fought 39-25 loss to the Terry Fox Ravens, will look for quarterback Jamie Shiho to light up the offence. Shiho finished with 264 all-purpose yards, passing for 156 yards and rushing for 108, including a 56-yard scoring run. Shiho's favourite target will likely be Michael Thind, who caught six passes for 112 yards and a score. On defence, look out for the Hyacks' current tackling leaders Gurvir Ghuman and Jeff Lugtu to hold down the fort against the Grizzlies.

Aside from the action on the field, the New West Homecoming game will be one to watch as the game ball will be parachuted onto the field by the BC Sky Diving team and followed by fireworks after the game.

In a cross-conference battle, can the Grizzlies tear apart the Hyacks offence? Or will the Hyacks bring out the fireworks in more ways than one? Tune in this week to find out!

- New Westminster **QB Jamie Shiho** had passed for 156 yards and a touchdown, and rushed for 108 yards with a touchdown, in a 39-25 loss to Terry Fox.
