MT. DOUGLAS RAMS AT SOUTH DELTA SUN DEVILS

In a rematch of last year's Subway Bowl final, the South Delta Sun Devils (0-1) host the Mt. Douglas Rams (1-0) in this week's highly anticipated game between two top-ranked Western Conference rivals.

The South Delta Sun Devils had a difficult time getting on the board last week in their 34-8 loss against Vancouver College last week and will look to bounce back in time to face the Rams. In last week's game, grade 10 standout Michael Calvert's kick return for a touchdown was one of the team's silver linings. Calvert also recorded three picks and a fumble recovery in the loss, and will look to help the Sun Devils get their first regular season win of the season. Other players of note will be running back Grant McDonald, who led all AAA players in rushing during four exhibition games this season with 32 carries for 532 yards and ten touchdowns.

The Rams, consistently a highly-rated squad, proved that they're going to be a tough team to beat in their 41-7 win over Notre Dame last week. Several leaders on offence for the Rams included Declann Michielin, who carried 11 times for 134 yards, and quarterback Gideon Kremler, who finished the day going 9-of-14 for 179 yards and three touchdowns. Two of Kremler's touchdowns were caught by Gavin Cobb, who recorded six catches for 106 yards in the win. On defence, the Rams also had solid performances by Mike Olson, Aidan Kachanoski and Declann Michielin, who all finished with eight tackles each. In addition, Olson had two fumble recoveries while Kachanoski also had one.

The Sun Devils and the Rams are expected to be the two of the championship contenders in the AAA Division this season so the fans are sure to see an exciting match-up in a game that is not only a re-match of last year's Subway Bowl final but potentially a preview of this year's as well!

- Terry Fox **RB Jeremie Kankolongo** had nine carries for 146 yards and three touchdowns in his team's 32-0 blanking of Lord Tweedsmuir.
- Lord Tweedsmuir's **Tyson Gilbert** had 12 tackles and two sacks in a 32-0 loss to Terry Fox.
- Rutland **RB Matt Klak** had nine carries for 118 yards and three touchdowns (including one on an 80-yard run), while teammate **RB Dakota Robertson** had 16 carries for 110 yards. Klak also had a pair of sacks, while Robertson recorded nine solo tackles.
- New Westminster **QB Jamie Shiho** threw touchdown passes of 80- and 55- yards to **REC Michael Thind** and **REC Justin Swartz**, respectively, while QB Nick Hauka hit Swartz with a 81-yard major as part of a 42-7 win over Belmont.
- Mt. Douglas **QB Gideone Kremler** went 9-of-14 for 179 yards and three touchdowns in a 41-7 win over Notre Dame. He also scored on a 12-yard rush.
- Handsworth **RB Leon Kyoya** had a 70-yard touchdown reception, and added rushing scores from two and eight yards in a 24-21 win over Argyle. **QB Sam Tholl** went 8-of-11 for 132 yards and two touchdowns in the win.
