Coming off a win last weekend, the St. Thomas More Knights (3-0) will visit the Terry Fox Ravens (3-0) in this week's Game of the Week taking place at Percy Perry Stadium.

After handing the Kelowna Owls their first loss of the season by a score of 27-13, the undefeated Ravens are looking to continue their winning streak this week against a very tough Knights team. In last week's win, Taylor Poitras and Jeremie Kankolongo led the ground attack with both players rushing for over 100 yards. Poitras led the way with 18 carries for 169 yards and two touchdowns, while Kankolongo carried for 114 yards two scores. These two players are sure to make a splash again in this contest. In addition, the Ravens' defence was able to effectively contain Kelowna's dual-threat quarterback Parker Simson to only 62 yards rushing on 12 carries showing that they won't be intimidated by anybody.

The Knights, who defeated the Lord Tweedsmuir Panthers by a score of 29-7 last week, had strong performances by Luca Bellini and Lucas Dalla-Vecchia. Dalla-Vecchia finished the day with 21 carries for 101 yards and a score and also caught a touchdown pass, while Bellini rushed for a touchdown and recorded a safety and seven tackles on defence. Other standouts for the Knights included Nico Cesarei (five tackles and three sacks), Matt Smigel (seven tackles), and Ben Steele (six tackles).

- Abbotsford **RB Dion Pellerin** had 23 carries for 182 yards and two scores, and caught two passes for 57 yards in a 38-17 win over Centennial. Teammate **RB Dylan Manocha** had 18 rushes for 75 yards and two TDs.
- Terry Fox **RB Taylor Poitras** had 18 carries for 169 yards and two touchdowns in a 27-13 win over Kelowna. Teammate **RB Jeremie Kankolongo** ran for 114 yards and also had a pair of touchdowns.
- St. Thomas More **RB Lucas Dalla-Vecchia** had 21 carries for 101 yards and a touchdown, and also had a TD reception in a 29-7 win over Lord Tweedsmuir.
- Seaquam **QB Tristen Yanciw** had a pair of rushing touchdowns, and threw touchdown strikes of 72-yards (**REC Tyson Philpot**) and 23-yards (**REC Ty Mennie**) in an upset 35-34 win over Handsworth. **RB Maskaki Kawanami** scored on a 16-yard sweep for the winning points.
- Handsworth **REC Jacob Ghazizadeh** had three touchdowns in a 35-34 loss to Seaquam.
- Notre Dame **QB Anthony Crescenzo** had two rushing touchdowns and a 50-yard TD pass in a 35-7 win over Belmont. Teammate **RB Adam Turrin** scored two majors, including one on a 75-yard run off tackle, as well as kicked five PATs.
- Argyle **QB Cole Theobald** went 13-of-27 in the air for 129 yards and three touchdowns to lead his team to a historic 21-0 win over West Vancouver in the school's first-ever Triple A game.

- Abbotsford **REC Chase Claypool** made four catches for 109 yards, three of them going for touchdowns in a 42-0 win over Pitt Meadows. He also returned a 65-yard punt for a score, and had a 28-yard run on his lone carry of the game while adding seven tackles on defence. **QB John Madigan** went 10-of-22 for 222 yards and four touchdowns.
- Langley **RB Azuka Okoli** had 10 carries for 154 yards and two touchdowns in a 54-0 win over Moscrop. **REC Max Joseph** hauled in touchdown passes of 70 and 22 yards in the win.
- Mission's **Devon Pott** had five sacks as part of a school-record 10 sack day in a 10-9 win over Robert Bateman. **RB Joeda Cannon** rushed 14 times for 117 yards in that game, while **RB Thomas Janke** rushed 12 times for 79 yard and a touchdown. Ethan Homan kicked a 32-yard FG for the winning points.
- Vernon **QB Justin Haverkamp** had 16 carries for 103 yards and two touchdowns, while also throwing a 75-yard touchdown strike to **REC Ben Hladik** in a 27-8 win over Valleyview.
- John Barsby **QB Nathanael Durkan** went 4-of-9 for 124 yards and one TD pass as part of a 42-20 win over Windsor.
- Nanaimo District **REC Nik Lindstrom** caught touchdown passes of 21, 32, and 31 yards in a 40-0 win over Timberline. **QB Reece Madison** threw for two touchdowns in the game, while backup **QB Maren Bradbrooke** threw for one TD.
- Vancouver College **RB Jasper Schiedel** rushed for 112 yards and one score while **RB Michael Le** rushed for 93 yards and two scores in a 49-21 win over New Westminster.
- New Westminster **REC Michael Thind** had eight receptions for 64 yards and a touchdown in a 49-21 loss to Vancouver College. On defence, **Jeff Lugtu**, **Marcel Wang**, and **Kevin Osea** recorded eight tackles each.
- Mt. Douglas **QB Gideone Kremler** went 20-of-26 for 178 and threw three touchdown passes, while **RB Declann Michielin** ran for 104 yards and two touchdowns in the game and adding eight tackles and two interceptions as a linebacker in a 39-6 win over South Delta.
